Principal's Report

Over the last few weeks there has been some great feedback provided to homeroom teachers who have contacted families. Building relationships with our families is really valued and we will continue this contact over the year ahead.

SPA reports will be released on Compass at the end of next week. The SPA is about student performance, attitude to learning and preparedness to learn. They are not an assessment of academic performance.

Next week the NAPLAN testing will take place for year 7 and 9 students. These tests give us valuable data to assess students learning and where we need to focus our programs. If parents have any questions about NAPLAN testing, I encourage you to contact the school.

Parent teacher bookings can now be made on Compass. These will be held on Wednesday evening April 5th and in the morning on Thursday April 6th. There will be no classes on Thursday. I encourage parents to bring along students to take part in these interviews. If you need support in making appointments, please contact the office. Sessions do fill quickly so I encourage parents to look to make appointments as soon as they can.

The Year 9 and 10 students who participated in the sports program on Tuesday did a wonderful job representing our school. I am very proud of the positive feedback received about their sporting behaviour, participation level and success.

The weather is starting to turn so please ensure you child has the correct school uniform for these cooler mornings. Students wearing hoodies and non-uniform jumpers will be asked to put them in their locker. McPhersons has a good supply of long pants, tracksuit pants and kilts. Our uniform provides several options, and we ask parents to support us by ensuring students have correct uniform on when they leave home, including the correct footwear. 



NSC BOOK REPORT

SHATTER ME

Tahereh Mafi

Shatter me is a dystopian fiction that tells the story of a 16-year-old girl, who has never been able to experience human touch because when she touches anyone, she kills them. Labelled a freak, and a monster she finds herself locked up in an asylum where she is left in isolation until the reestablishment, who has taken over, decide to use her as a weapon.



Juliette has been in isolation for 264 days. She has begun to doubt her sanity and sees herself as a monster who deserves what she is going through. The news of a cell mate scares her and drives her crazy, convinced that it will be some psycho murderous villain. But when the reestablishment releases her, only to try to use her as some type of weapon, Juliette discovers she is stronger than she realised. With the help of an old friend, she decided to fight them, for her future and her freedom, truly beautiful.

Tahereh is so extremely descriptive when she explains how Juliette feels, and the affects that lack of human contact has had on her lead character. She really had me understanding the message in the book. I personally could easily imagine the psychological issues suffered by Juliette, her character is so relatable. I think any teenager could instantly connect to this book, whoever the character might be. I personally connected with Juliette, Kenji and Aaron.

I find It hard to pick my favourite character after only reading a few of the books from the world. There must be a lot more to the characters that I don't know or understand yet, for now my favourite character is Aaron Warner. Although he is obnoxious, arrogant, and selfish in the first book, there is so much more to him, and his character development is so noticeable he truly is so misunderstood. The author did so well with this character!

I loved this book beyond words, it left me wanting so much more content. I was excited beyond words (and intimidated) when I learnt that is a series with 6 books and 5 novels. I am still making my way through this series; it is fast paced, and I lost myself in the pages. It somehow ripped my heart out and put it back together in just 329 pages.

I recommend this book to 13 and over. Although it is a gorgeous story I wish everyone could read, there is a lot of mature themes, like self-harm, mental issues, blood and gore, and more. When I read this book, it reminded me of 'Divergent' and 'The Hunger Games' era.

GET ACTIVE VICTORIA

We're excited to announce that applications for Round 6 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program are now open!

Eligible families can apply for \$200 vouchers and use them at their registered Get Active Kids Voucher Activity Provider without having to worry about upfront costs. Children aged 0-18 and

named on a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card and Medicare card are eligible. Apply now at www.getactive.vic.gov.au/vouchers to receive your voucher to use with an approved activity provider. Present the voucher code to your activity provider and get up to \$200 off the registration and membership fee (as well as any included uniforms and/or equipment).

If you have already paid for your child's activity, you can apply for a reimbursement. You can only apply for either one voucher or reimbursement for each child in Round 6.

Important Dates:

- 21 February to 10 May 2023: Round open for parents, carers or guardians to apply for a Voucher or Reimbursement
- 28 November 2022 to 10 May 2023: Period that you can seek a reimbursement for eligible expenditure
- 21 May 2023: Last day for vouchers to be presented to activity providers.

Special consideration is available if your child/dependent is residing in Victorian Care Services, a temporary or provisional visa holder, undocumented migrant or international student.
