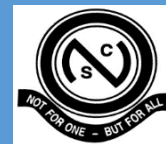

Principal's Report

Dear NSC families,

Welcome back to Term 4! I hope the break was an enjoyable one for all our families. This term always seems to pass by very quickly and we are encouraging our students to be aware of the need to keep on top of, and catch-up on, work which will contribute to the successful completion of all subjects. The second assessment tasks for the semester will be available to be viewed in over the next week on Compass. Tasks which have not been submitted need to be completed for students to gain a satisfactory grade for each unit. Teachers have been making arrangements for time to complete these and this may include time at home, during lunchtime or after school. Please support us as we work with students to provide opportunities for work to be completed to demonstrate a satisfactory completion of all subjects.

SPA and attendance awards – These were presented in the whole school Assembly on Friday. Well done to the students who have demonstrated excellent commitment to achieving their best.

Parent guide to Career Advice – This is a great opportunity for our parents and students to attend an evening to prepare for the future labour force. We know that parents are key influencers in the employment pathways their children take. This information session will support parents in providing advice and guidance. A recent report by Victoria's new Skills Authority has suggested Victoria is facing a labour shortage of about 373,000 workers by 2025 (just 3 years from now). It is thought there will be a shortage of 65,000 health, aged and disability workers, 90,000 service sector workers, 41,000 teaching staff, 34,000 construction workers and 64,000 financial and IT professionals. These shortages will impact our regional area and all of Victoria metropolitan areas. We need to help strengthen pathways to align with where the jobs are and better equip our young people, schools and parents with knowledge about the labour market, future job opportunities and skills needed for the future.

Research has found that parents are the most influential people in a young person's career decisions, and now more than ever it's important that parents are equipped to support their children in navigating the world of work, the expansive opportunities available to them and the decisions they need to make.

To support parents in supporting their children, Numurkah Secondary College in partnership with the Industry Training Hub – Shepparton and TwoPointZero Career Coaching, will be presenting 'a parent's guide to career advice' to help you understand your child's career personality and its impact on their career decisions, jobs of the future, career opportunities in your region for young people and tips for helping your child make good career decisions. In addition, a panel of local employers will share insights from their businesses on the work and training opportunities they offer young people and what they look for when recruiting.

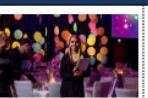

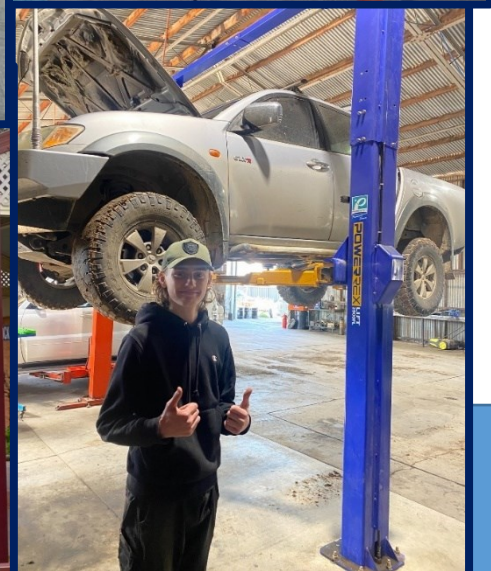
Careers: Work Experience

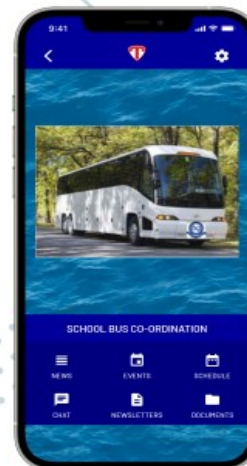
