

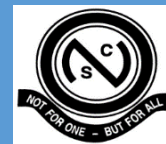

Principal's Report

We are entering the final part of our school year and I would like you to support us in ensuring students are completing work tasks, attending every day to complete this year in positive way and to be well prepared for the move up a year level.

School Captains 2023 – Congratulations to the successful candidates for the 2023 School Captain positions. All candidates did a wonderful job preparing their applications, speaking to the whole school about their goals and finally, being interviewed by a small panel. SPA reports - These will be released on compass next week and provide an opportunity to look at how each student is progressing. This report is based on effort and managing learning and is not a measure of academic performance. All students should be able to achieve a SPA average of above 4:0. If you have concerns about the SPA result please make an appointment to meet with your child's Year Level Leader.

Exams – Our Year 12 exams are currently underway, and the students are working hard to achieve their best results. Year 11 exams commence on November 15th for all VCE units. Year 10 exams commence on November 16th. It is important students attend exams to complete their year.

Parent guide to Career Advice Tuesday November 22nd – This is a great opportunity for parents and families to attend an evening with industry and careers teams. Parents need to support young people consider their future pathways and it is challenging to offer advice which is up to date and relevant. This evening includes general presentations about career pathways as well as presentations from local employers and industry. 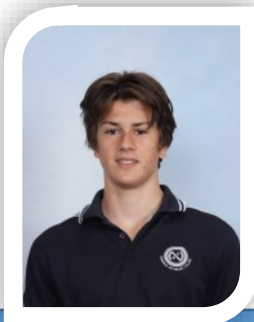

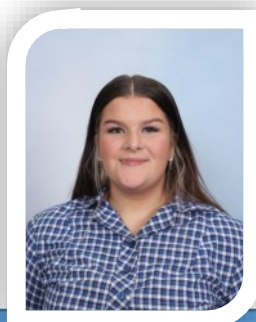

School Captains for 2023

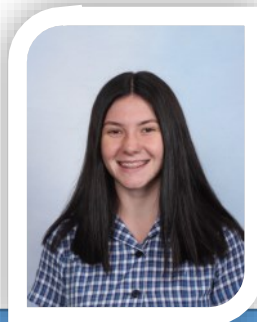

Important information from the Technology Department.

When working in the science, technical areas or anywhere else where plant, equipment and machinery is being used, we must follow all the required safety systems within the workplace as per the Safe Operating Instructions and Operational Procedures. Every piece of equipment has its own information to assist and direct users on its safe use. At all times we need to ensure we follow the manufactures information and where required undertake a dynamic risk assessment. It is unacceptable not to follow the directions of the operating procedures relating to safety equipment or the direction of a staff member relating to safety.

Everyone has a responsibility for their safety and of those who they work with at any time. Please check your work colleagues are safe and any safety equipment is in good working order prior to operating equipment, tools or undertaking experiments. If there are behavioural or safety concerns, please report it to the school staff so we can address the issue as soon as possible.

We are all bound by very clear Health and Safety Policies and Procedures, and we would like to ensure that everyone takes their responsibilities relating to safe systems of work at all times in a responsible way. If you are unsure how a machine or piece of equipment operates or what safety equipment is required to use the equipment then please ask for assistance.

Students are reminded that they must wear enclosed leather shoes when undertaking classes with science experiments, technical activities including metal work, woodwork, hospitality and textiles. Vaccination Bus & Outreach Clinics

GV Health is proud to have a dedicated vaccination bus, "Jabba the Bus". We also run outreach clinics to a range of locations.

The following vaccinations are available:

- COVID-19 vaccinations for people aged 5 years and above (Pfizer vaccine)
- COVID-19 vaccinations for people aged 18 years and above (Moderna Bivalent booster)
- Japanese Encephalitis vaccines for people:
 - who work at or live on a piggery; who work directly with pigs (i.e. pig transport, veterinarians and others involved in the care of pigs); or who work in pork abattoirs or rendering plants
 - who work directly in mosquito surveillance (field or laboratory) or work in mosquito control
 - who work indirectly with mosquitos through management of mosquito-borne disease surveillance systems (e.g. sentinel animals) such as environmental health officers and workers, entomologists, and pest controllers
 - aged 50 years and above who spend 4+ hours outdoors a day in: Campaspe, Gannawarra, Greater Shepparton, Indigo, Loddon, Mildura, Moira, Swan Hill, Wodonga, or Towong.



Coverage areas for the Bus and outreach clinics include Greater Shepparton City Council, Moira Shire Council, Benalla Rural City Council, Strathbogie Shire Council, Mitchell Shire Council, Mansfield Shire Council and Murrindindi Shire Council.

The bus is disability friendly, holding three vaccination pods, with one pod able to accommodate a wheelchair and personal aids.

Vaccinations are FREE!

You can simply walk-in for your vaccination on the bus or at an outreach clinic – no bookings required!

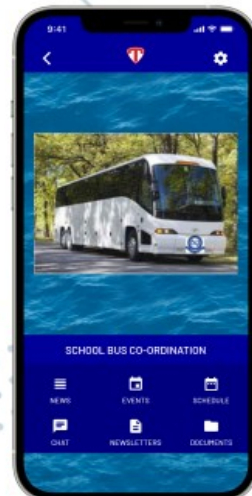
