Dear NSC families,



Hearing from our students is always important to us at Numurkah Secondary College. Earlier this year, every student completed the Attitudes to School Survey. This important survey allows students to identify what works well and not so well for them at school, but also provides important feedback to the school about how our students are feeling.

The survey results identified opportunities to talk to our students about key things that are important to them. This started with small group discussions on safety at school and ways we can work to ensure every student is *and* feels safe.

All staff have been involved in reviewing the insights our students have provided to us, and plans are in place to respond and to drive positive improvement in our school. Some of these have been immediate, and others will take a little more planning and development, and that is also underway.

One thing students told us is that feeling more visible, heard and part of their school is important, and we could not agree more! We have immediately introduced both an online and actual suggestion box so students can let us know what they are thinking any time. While we cannot promise to act on every suggestion, we will always listen and act where we can. We have already had a huge number of great ideas come though!

Reinvigorating a student forum is underway, with representatives from each year level meeting and discussing the things that really matter to our students. A Student Forum will also help to plan how changes can be made for the better.

There are other great initiatives we are working on in response to what students have told us, and I look forward to reporting on them into the future.

Our students' voices are incredibly important to us and we look forward to continuing to hear them more often and more loudly.

Cassius Turvey Vigil

Last Sunday (13/11) a vigil was held for Cassius Turvey organised and ran by the Shepparton Recociliation Group. Several people attended the event for Numurkah Secondary College to represent the school. The event was dedicated to the young Indigenous person, Cassius, who was beaten as he walked home from school in Perth and later died of his injuries on the 13 October this year. Similar events have been held around Australia in the last few weeks in support and recognition of this terrible crime.

The vigil on Sunday was overseen by Uncle Bobby Nichols, who welcomed us to country and held a smoking ceremony to cleanse us of any bad spirits we may have brought with us. He then spoke about the tragic event and resulting response from the First Nations community. This is best summerised by Cassius mother Mechelle:

"I don't want any more violence. I'm the only person who can get justice for my son. Stand alongside me, and I appreciate everyone, but I need to call out for calm. I am angry. Cassius' friends and family are angry. But I don't want any form of violence at any of these rallies in the name of my child, violence breeds violence. I want calm and peace. I don't want to feel prejudices, bias, I don't want to deal with stereotypes of First Nations people as violent,"

This message of peace was mirrored by the speakers at the event, discussing their own feelings about the events and the things that need to change to ensure this type of racialised violence does not continue in this country. Standing in the circle, calmly and peacefully honouring, not only Cassius, but any and all the First Nations people who have suffered at the hands of personal or structural racism.

Rest in peace Cassius.
