

## Yr. 7 First Aid



Odlege Small School ? ad a his wa In period three on the 25th of November our class attended a First Aid class where we learnt about CPR and snake bites. This was done by letting the class use CPR dummies. We then all tried chest compressions and after taking it in turns we got to use a training defibrillator. This was much easier than expected and you only had to press two buttons.

We then went on to learn about snake bites, where we were taught that if someone is bitten we must try and keep them as still as possible. Then we were all able to try using a special compression bandage. This guite hard as you had to stretch it the perfect amount to make the rectangles squares.

We then went on to learn about DRSABCD. This stood for danger, response, send for help, airway, breathing, CPR and finally, defibrillation. Overall it was really good and I learnt a lot.

On the 25th Of November during Focus, our class learnt about First Aid and CPR with Grace from PEADS Education, Grace

was the very kind nurse that taught us about First Aid. To begin with, we learnt about D.R.S.A.B.C.D which stood for Danger; Response; Send for help; Airway; Breathing, CPR and AED. Then we started to learn how to do CPR on dummies. We were given a picture and had to imagine that we found the person in that location. Using DRSABCD we worked through the steps to try and save them. I wasn't very

good at CPR so I was the person from our group that called for help and was talking Ella and Savannah through what needed to be done whilst they administered CPR. After this we learnt about snake bites and how to use the bandages to stop the venom from spreading around your body.

Students have learnt all things automotive during the semester, Disassembling Honda engines and repairing or replacing components, getting them running and furthermore Dyno testing. All engines worked after a small amount of diagnostic work.

As a group student also covered Vehicle Body Building techniques, where they have been working on a small 4 wheel drive car that is being converted into a utility vehicle.

Students can have more confidence working on their own cars in future and understand that all skills learnt in trades are transferable.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE AUSTRALIA FEDERAL POLICE

#### Information for families

The Australian Federal Police through the <u>Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation</u> is seeing a concerning global trend of teenage males being targeted to send explicit images of themselves and then blackmailed. This is called sexual extortion, or sextortion.

The AFP is urging families to have important safety conversations ahead of the school holidays to prevent young people from becoming victim. This crime can have serious wellbeing and psychological impacts.

#### How does sextortion start?

- Unsolicited friend and follow requests on social media
- Direct messages on one app and then being asked to keep chatting on a secondary app
- Conversations suddenly and quickly becoming sexualised
- Requests for sexualised images or content.

#### What can families do?

- Have open and regular conversations about your child's online activities and interactions
- Know what platforms, apps and games they are using and who they are interacting with
- Remain open and approachable, victims will be reluctant to come forward if they feel they will be punished or blamed
- Ensure your child knows that it is okay to leave conversations if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe
- Support your child and know how to respond. The <u>Online blackmail and sexual extortion response</u> <u>kit</u> has been created to recognise sextortion and get help.

The Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation is here to keep young people safe from online sexual exploitation and abuse.
