## Course Delivery

- Blended delivery - alternating one day per fortnight; face to face in the classroom and one day per fortnight online, over a 42 week period, excluding school holidays (48 weeks in total)
- On average, students must contribute at least 15 to 25 hours of study per week
- Practical placement of 120 hours must be undertaken within the duration of the course
- Prior to commencing the course, potential students are required to undergo a pre course Language Literacy and Numeracy assessment and demonstrate basic computer skills.
