Sports day

The Senior Sports Day is on Tuesday May 17th. Year 11 and 12 students not in teams will have normal classes running. Year 9 and 10 classes will not be running due to the high numbers involved in sport teams. Please ensure that if your child has signed up for a sport they attend.

COVID update

We are still seeing significant numbers of COVID in the community. We have been notified of some cases amongst our student group and families. We encourage our students to continue to test regularly.

Household contacts

Students and staff who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are no longer required to quarantine. They can return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times within their 7-day period and wear face masks indoors if they are aged 8 and above (unless they have a valid exemption). If, during this period, a household contact returns a positive RAT, they must isolate for 7 days and not attend school.

We have plenty of test kits available from the office and we encourage students to ensure they have kits at home to test when required.

This is almost completed for our Yr. 7 and Yr. 9 students. Our students have responded well to this process and have been respectful in completing these tasks over the past week.






