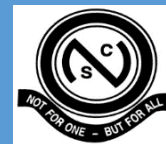

Dear NSC families,

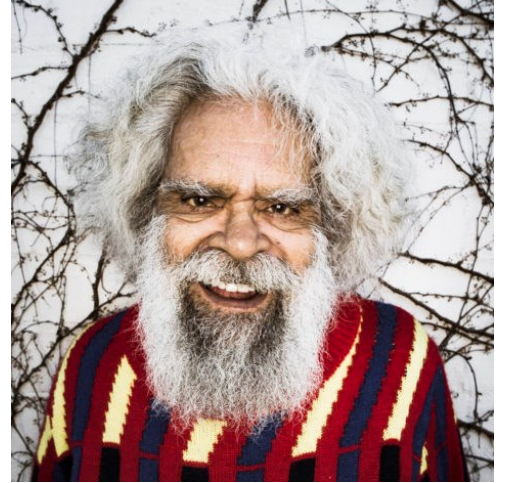

Department Update: COVID-19 isolation requirements.

Any student or staff member who tests positive to COVID-19 must now isolate for a minimum of 5 days instead of 7. If they are asymptomatic, they may return to school on day 6. If they are symptomatic, they must remain in isolation until day 7. If they have symptoms after 7 days, they are strongly advised to stay home until their symptoms have resolved.

As an additional risk mitigation, the Department of Health strongly recommends that those leaving isolation wear a face mask when away from home, both indoors and outdoors, and when they cannot physically distance. Those leaving isolation on day 6 should wear a mask for 5 days but particularly the first 2 days. Those leaving isolation on day 7 should wear a mask for 4 days but particularly the first 2 days. Those leaving isolation should consider taking a rapid antigen test before attending school.

IMPORTANT YR. 9 CAMP INFORMATION.

The year 9 camp departs at **9.10am 3rd October, the first day of Term 4**

- Students will not need any food or snacks from home. Mobile phones, Ipods and tablets are Not to be brought to camp.
- Students will return to school Friday 14th at 1.30pm.
- Could parents please make arrangements to pick their children up at 1.30pm.

From 2023, the new VCE Vocational Major will replace Intermediate and Senior VCAL. This means the VCE will recognise different students equally.

About the changes to senior secondary education

From 2023, students will have more education choices, a higher-quality curriculum and better workplace experiences.

The changes are a result of the [Review into Vocational and Applied Learning Pathways in Senior Secondary Schooling](#) (the Firth review) which found changes were needed to improve vocational learning in schools.
