ENGAGEMENT AND WELLBEING



This year we relaunched The Resilience Project, and have talked about the science behind the power of GEM. GEM stands for gratitude, empathy and mindfulness and simple reflections every day related to GEM can have a powerful impact on mental health and wellbeing.

Evidence tells us that one in four adolescents are likely to experience clinical levels of depression or anxiety before the age of 18, and scarily 2/3 of them will not seek help. Taking a few simple preventative steps will not completely prevent this from happening, and does not replace professional help but it DOES make a difference.

At NSC we are seeking to make the language of GEM and the simple practices related to The Resilience Project a part of our culture. Something we are, not just something we do. This can be greatly enhanced if GEM becomes part of the language at home too.

It is not hard either! Simply asking each day "What went well for you?" is enough to get started! The Resilience Project has put together a Parent and Carer Hub- full of background information, hints and activities with video explainers. Mobile Phones and Social Media

Just another quick reminder of NSC expectations around use of mobile phones and social media. Problems linked to social media conversations continue to flow into schools, even though they do not occur at school usually. However recently we have seen the negative impacts phone use while at school can have and continue to seek family support in tackling these concerns as a team effort.

As such we are reminding everyone that phones are **banned at school between 9am and 3:20pm.** If a student has a phone it must be **in their locker** between those times and cannot be used, **even at recess or lunchtime.** If you need to contact your student you can do so via the School Office on 5862 1088.

The incidents related to phones are significant and serious. They are not unique to our school, which is why the ban on mobile phones is statewide throughout Victoria. We treat the safety of our students incredibly seriously and as such we are tightening up expectations and consequences around breaches of this rule.

If a student chooses not to place their phone in their locker, or to hand over their phone during Homeroom and are caught with it between 9am and 3:20pm, it will be confiscated and kept in the safe within the office until a parent or guardian picks it up for them. If they break this rule more than once, consequences may include external suspension.
