

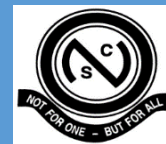

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Principal's Report

Dear NSC families,

This last week has certainly added some extra challenges to our local community. While the significant flooding seen in some of the surrounding towns seems to have spared Numurkah township, I am very aware that many of our farming families have had crop damage and loss which will impact greatly on their income and ability to provide stock with feed.

We appreciated your support when we asked for Years 7 and 8 students to be home early this week due to staff being unable to travel to school. Most of our staff are back now which will enable our full program to be running. Of course, there are still some unknowns with the potential of heavy rain over the next week, so we will keep everyone informed if there are further changes. Please let us know at the school if we can provide support in any way.

It was very disappointing that the Numurkah Show was not able to go ahead. An enormous amount of work had been done by the show committee and it was a real loss to the community that, once again, this was called off.

Year 12 Graduation – Our Year 12 students finish this week. This is always exciting but also an emotional time. At our assembly on Thursday afternoon I used this quote from Steve Jobs “.. the only way to be truly satisfied is to do what you believe is great work. And the only way to do great work is to love what you do.” My message to our Year 12's was to have happy adventures, amazing experiences, and joy in their journey to find what you love to do.”

Several of our students from this year level have already moved on to employment and others are planning to pursue tertiary studies next year. I am very proud of our Year 12 students who have come through some challenging years.

Exams – Our VCE students commence exams on Wednesday the 26th of October with Englis; we wish them all the best and know that they have put in the work to achieve their best. Years 11 and 10 students will have exams later in the term beginning on the 16th of November.

Parent guide to Career Advice – The event scheduled for Monday 24th of October has been postponed. We are waiting for confirmation of a new date.

Year 9 camp program – The 15 Mile Creek Camp was held over the first 2 weeks of term. Despite the impact of flooding, which led to some changes, the students had an amazing time and showed their ability to cope with challenges and their capacity to work in teams.

Kibi, and and Charlee (absent) have restored a seat for our school yard as part of their VCAL WRS (Work Related Skills) studies. Well done on a fine job.



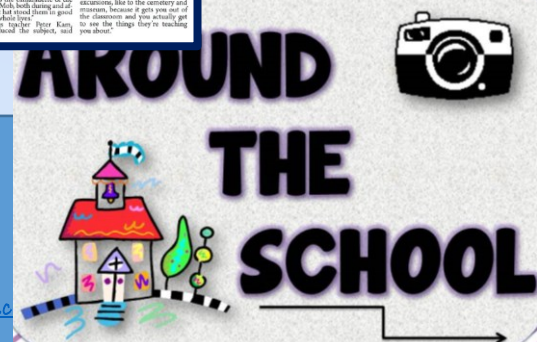

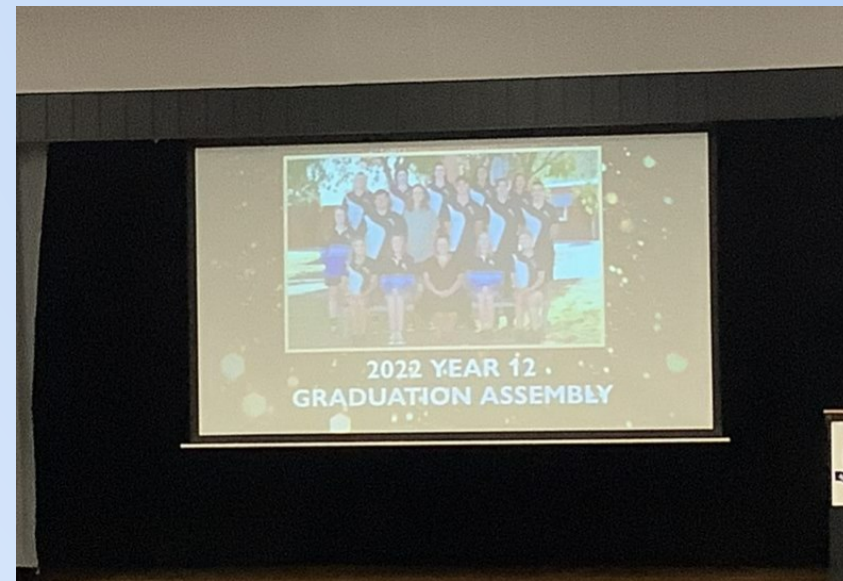

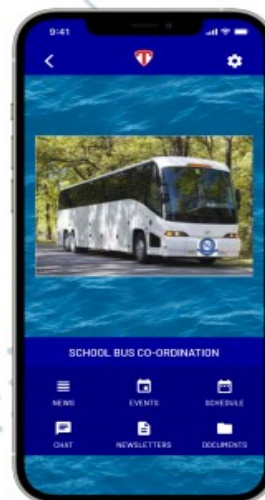
